Coral Reefs in Danger

Coral reef biologists are often asked the same question again and again: "When my kids grow up, will there still be coral reefs?"

According to a news article on NPR.org, new research shows that in a hotter climate, urgent action will be needed to prevent the vast majority of coral species from being destroyed by the end of the century. Humans will have to limit the release of greenhouse gases, but that alone may not be enough. Reefs may also need a helping hand through efforts like restoration or coral breeding to create varieties which can survive in warmer water.

Without these efforts, the future doesn't look bright. It is said that around a quarter of all fish species cannot live without coral reefs. Millions of people around the world also rely on them for food, jobs and flood protection, since reefs help prevent storms and waves from destroying coastlines.

The worst damage to coral reefs is caused by three climate issues: marine heatwaves, ocean *acidification and overall ocean warming. The oceans have been hurt the most by climate change so far, absorbing the majority of heat produced by human activity.

Marine heatwaves, which are periods of usually high sea temperatures, are expected to become more serious, and the high temperatures cause corals to turn white in what's known as "coral bleaching."

Corals live in partnership with tiny *algae. The algae provide food for corals and help produce their bright and strong colors, but under periods of serious heat stress, the corals lose the algae, leaving only white skeletons. Some reefs can recover over time, but many die as a result. These mass bleaching events have been extremely serious in places like the Great Barrier Reef in Australia, which has experienced three in the last five years.

Ocean acidification is caused by carbon dioxide. Once absorbed by the oceans, carbon dioxide from things like burning fossil fuels reacts with the water to make it more *acidic. The increased acidification can destroy reefs and makes it harder for corals to build their skeletons. The reefs' growth rates are also reduced by overall ocean warming. This is a problem because corals have to continually grow to protect themselves from both waves and storms, and consumption by other animals.

3 ライティングテスト (16点)

I think all Japanese schools should change their sports festival to a cooler season, such as spring or fall. I have two reasons.

First, Japanese summers are very hot and humid, so it's not very safe for students and parents. During events, students might get too hot and feel sick.

They also might need to stand in the sun all day, which can cause overheating and possible illness. Parents also may feel uncomfortable standing around in extreme heat.

Second, the spring and fall seasons are cooler and have better weather. If the sports festival is held during one of these seasons, there is less chance of rain and students can run and move more comfortably. If students feel a bit cold, they can always wear a sweatshirt or sweatpants, so the cooler temperatures aren't a big problem.

It would be a big change to tradition, but for these reasons I feel changing all Japanese sports festivals to spring or fall would be a good idea.
