The Navajo Code Talkers

The Navajo (pronounced 'na-va-ho') are a Native American *tribe who come from the southwestern region of the USA. Today, there are around 300,000 of them, and most of them speak their native language, which is very difficult for others to learn as a second language.

This fact meant that some Navajo had a very important role to play in World War II, as code talkers. A code talker is someone who uses a rare or unusual language to send important messages for the military in a war, so that the enemy cannot understand or translate the messages. A man named Philip Johnston had the idea to use the Navajo language for this in 1942. He had grown up on a Navajo *reservation as a child, and he was one of only 30 non-native Navajo, or 'outsiders', who could speak the language fluently at that time. He convinced leaders of the US Army that it could be used as a code, and so they began to gather Navajo soldiers to help them.

Around 400 Navajo soldiers played an important role in World War II by sending radio messages in a special Navajo code that they learned in a training camp before joining the war. They created special words to express military words in English, some of which didn't exist in the Navajo language. So, the word 'submarine' became 'iron fish' in the Navajo code. The Navajo code talkers impressed the army chiefs/leaders with their ability to send messages quickly and accurately, which was very important in urgent situations in the war. Their code is the only spoken military code which has never been broken. Unfortunately, because it was so secret, the Navajo were not recognized for their efforts for over 20 years, until 1968, when the Navajo code talker project was made public. In 2000, President Bill Clinton awarded the Navajo code talkers with gold and silver medals for taking part in this important wartime program.
