Bear Hibernation*

Where do bears go in the winter? Like many animals, it's difficult for bears to find food when the weather is cold and snowy. So, instead of hunting for food in bad weather, many bears find a place to sleep until the winter is over. This is called hibernation.

To prepare for hibernation, bears eat a lot of food while the weather is still warm. By doing this, bears can increase the amount of fat in their body. The more fat a bear stores before hibernation, the better chance it will have to survive the long winter without eating food. Brown and black bears eat many different kinds of food, but eating a lot of fish and small animals is the best way to add fat.

Just before the winter arrives, bears planning to hibernate* need to find a good place to sleep. The best hibernation homes are caves, hollow* trees, or large holes in the ground. After the bear finds a comfortable location and falls asleep, its heart rate slows down from 40-50 beats per minute to only 8-9 beats per minute. During this time, bears do not need to eat, drink or even take a toilet break! The hibernation time period depends on the location and weather. A bear's hibernation time ranges from only a few weeks to up to seven months.

Bears end their hibernation when the spring arrives. The warmer weather means more food is available, and so the long sleep finally ends. When bears come out of hibernation, they have usually lost 15-30% of their original body weight. However, the bear's muscles and bones are not changed at all. Scientists are studying this surprising detail in hopes of using it in the future to help human beings.

Interestingly, not all bears hibernate. Some bears, such as sun bears*, live in very warm places that have no winter. Because they have year-round access to food, there is no need for these bears to hibernate. Polar bears don't hibernate, either. These bears are experts at finding food in snowy and icy conditions and there is no reason for them to sleep for long periods of time.
